
"Saluting Branches" Tree Care Program Honors CRC Veterans

Spearheaded by Jim Maloney — who is a highly experienced and well-credentialed arborist and forestry expert at Niagara Mohawk, a consultant with the City of Cortland's tree management efforts, and a close collaborator with another local tree enthusiast and community treasure, Mike Dexter — Jim is also deeply involved in the *Saluting Branches* program and was instrumental in enabling the CRC to be included in the program.

Established in 2015, *Saluting Branches* began by directing its time and talent at national (or Federal) veterans cemeteries such as Arlington National Cemetery or the Gerald B.H. Solomon Saratoga National Cemetery. More recently, the success of the program has enabled it to extend tree care to other cemeteries with significant quantities of interred veterans. The CRC is one such facility, as visitors to our grounds will find veterans.

The CRC is one such facility, as visitors to our grounds will find veterans from nearly every war and American conflict — including the War of 1812, the Civil War, WWI and WWII, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Iraq War, the War in Afghanistan, and other conflicts.

While 2022's data is still being tallied, 2021 saw the *Saluting Branches* nationwide effort deploy 2,572 volunteers to care for trees at 77 veteran properties, for an approximate value of \$2.6 million in donated services!
